Please find below 7 questions. I expect you to answer between 3 and 5 of them and you don't get more credit for answering more. I expect roughly 1000 words total, about twice as many words as you see typed on this piece of paper. If I can't read what you write, I'll scan it and send it to you and you can type it for me and send it back. Explicitly refer to examples, and ideas from class. You will get credit by using specific references. You must provide more than philosophical ideas and ideals.

You will be judged not on what your answer is, but how you support it with material from the class. But you do have to address the question that is asked.

1. Consider if James Ferguson ("What Should be Done?" from "The Anti-Politics Machine") met Paul Polack (Out of Poverty). What might they agree about? What might they disagree about? Who else that we've met would they think is great and/or wrong?
2. Consider an effort/project/outreach we learned about in this class that failed. Why did it fail, and what would you do otherwise to have prevented this failure? How would you support your chosen action and who have we met or discussed in class would support your choices? This can be a group project, but not your group project.
3. Consider an effort/project/outreach that we learned about in this class that succeeded. Identify the insight that you think made the project successful and support your answer. but not your group project.
4. Someone asks you, "why don't we just give the poor people money?" What do you think would happen? What might you advise to someone who was going to try this? Has anyone tried doing this? Please formulate an answer for this person.
5. You don't have to leave the country to find an impoverished community. Take the Navajo Nation, 174,000 people at the "four corners" of Colorado, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico – 40% without running water. Last year, three groups worked with a nonprofit there, so we have some idea of the level of poverty they experience. You've also read about them. If you were to dedicate yourself to their well-being, what would you do?...Or in Ferguson's words: "What Should be Done?" Support your answers with references to class material.
6. We had several speakers: Tymon Manning (US Peace Corps Recruiter), Daniel Weins of Journeyman International, Jim Keese (improved stoves in Peru), Peter Teller (AID Africa), Roger Burton (former international business consultant), Nathan Bair and Sara Della Ripa (InPress Technologies post-partum hemorrhage mitigation), Jill Bolster-White (Transitions Mental Health, SLO), Pete Schwartz (home visit). Pick two or more of these who you think would agree (or have common development models) and what they would agree about and why.
7. Consider when our class met for the first time in September. What was your model of development and your role in global development at the time, and how has it changed

during the quarter? Describe some documents/videos/activities/interventions/discussions that helped inform your views and why they were influential for you.
