

The final exam will cover everything we've read about, discussed, and presented in class. Including past group presentations. The focus will be on concepts, development models and cultures rather than names, titles and dates.

I've posted last year's final exam on our main webpage. We may have a few essay questions like the ones on last year's exam. However, we will also have some short answer questions as well as multiple choice questions to identify or compare ideas.

I've also posted the list of all the "quiz questions" we've had up until now. Many of these questions are detailed and we've likely forgotten the answers. Many of them are more detailed than I would ask on the final exam. However, they may serve to remind you of things we talked about.

I encourage you to visit our timeline and look over all the activities and speakers we've had. It may do to consider what the general message and discussion was for each one.

Questions will not require specific knowledge of any one event, but may greatly benefit from specific knowledge. For instance, maybe I describe something I want to do... like give \$100 bills to everyone, or a new tractor to each village, or a dishwasher to save them time, or a library in a village center. You could draw from concepts in the class to describe why this isn't or is a good idea. You could also give examples of someone who tried something like that and how it worked out for them.
